Result area 1 - To protect, promote and fulfil universal access to sexual and Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights

In Yemen, this result area focuses mainly on awareness programs that promote the importance of access to sexual and reproductive health services, and on improved coordination mechanisms among SRHR partners to enhance the sharing of data, good practices and information.

Result area 3 - Better public and private health care for family planning, pregnancies Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights

RESULTS
The health of mothers and children are at severe risk in Yemen. Partners working on SRHR give priority to support maternal health and to decrease infant mortality. Therefore, safe motherhood services like safe delivery and antenatal care are considered as utmost important for the Netherlands.

Assessment of the results achieved across the entire result area 3	
Assess achieved results compared to planning:	B. Results achieved better than planned
Reasons for result achieved.	The key challenge faced in this approach, however, was that there were delays in distribution processes from the governorate further down to the district and health facility level leading to reports of stock-outs at some service delivery point even though the commodities were available at the central or governorate level. Starting in 2019, UNFPA has hence agreed to support the Ministry to distribute the commodities up to the district level again under the direct stewardship of the Ministry of Public Health and Population. Despite the challenging and volatile context of Yemen, the Dutch supported partners have been able to contribute significantly to infant and maternal healthcare. This is related to the fact that, within the SRHR spectrum, infant and maternal healthcare is not such a sensitive theme, which creates space to develop activities.

Result area 4 - Improved access to contraceptives and medicines Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights

RESULTS
Due to the collapse of the health system in Yemen as a result of the war, the country has been in great need of contraceptives and other life saving medicines. When it comes to SRHR services and measures, many women and girls are completely dependent on the support provided by (I)NGO's and UN organizations.
