Result area 1 - Peace Processes & political governance Security and Rule of law

RESULTS
A significant part of the Dutch ODA budget for Afghanistan goes to the security sector. In addition to our support for the army and the police, the Netherlands have successes in strengthening the security sector from the bottom-up (civil society) as well through its UN Habitat safer city GIZ rule of law programs. Through our UN Habitat safer cities project, urban populations and municipality staff have been trained about rights for urban citizens which has influenced policies and improved security in neighbourhoods. On a political level the Netherlands, through its support to the Afghanistan Reconstruction Trust Fund led by the World Bank, supports the government to be more inclusive and accountable. The fund has allowed for an improvement in access and quality of governance and government services to the poorest women and children - the poorest of the poorest.

Result area 2 - Rule of Law Security and Rule of law

RESULTS
In cooperation with the German Development Cooperation Organization (BMZ), the Netherlands has through a GIZ rule of law program in the north of Afghanistan contributed to bridging the gap between the formal and informal justice sector. We increased the participation of women in both formal and informal justice sectors as well as in universities and schools which has led to better access to justice for Afghan women. As a result of the program, women participation in civil society organizations has increased as well.
